Refer to cleaning guidance document Ref: 04</li> <li>Ensure cleaning materials to include blue roll, and used wipes are disposed of after use within the designated clinical waste bins provided.</li> <li>Inspection bench – Max 1 person allowed at anyone time.</li> <li>Current wrapping bench has two winders, which are spaced 2M apart.
